Farewell 1


As always, we wanted our year 11 pupils to bow out in style and our celebrations were emotional and memorable.

Our extremely talented singers, dancers and actors put on a rousing performance of The Wiz to cap off a great year of experiences for our budding West End superstars!




Sixth Form
