



Year 7 Catch Up Funding Provision and Impact for 2017/18

All Saints Catholic High School Year 7 Catch Up Funding Statement 2017-18. In 2013, the Government introduced the Year 7 Catch-up Fund, this was to enable all secondary schools to help all students who did not achieve at least level 4 in the Key Stage national curriculum (SATS) tests in reading and/or mathematics. Therefore, in 2017-18, schools will receive extra funding for each Year 7 student who has not attained an age related level in reading, writing and/or mathematics at Key Stage 2 national curriculum tests.

All Saints Funding Allocation 2017.2018

All Saints Catholic High School will receive in the region of £15,000 during the academic year 2017-18. This is for 60 students for Reading, 42 for Maths and the 33 common to both tests who arrived with us with less than the 100 score at KS2 SATS. As in 2016.2017 Catch-Up funds will contribute towards the cost of additional teaching capacity in English and Maths in September 2017 both fully qualified teachers who support literacy and numeracy within Year 7.

All Saints Provision Plan for 2017/2018

For those pupils who arrive with a scaled score of below 90 in Reading they will have 2 hours of additional Literacy lessons (not taking Spanish in years 7 and 8) .

Other Interventions that take place for these students as a consequence of additional staffing include:-

Some eligible pupils receive small group support with a focus on reading intervention during English lessons, delivered by the additional teacher in English.

Some eligible pupils are withdrawn from PE/humanities once a week for literacy intervention, delivered by the additional teacher in English.

Morning reading and numeracy interventions during registration weekly.

Transition activities for year 4, 5 and 6 students focusing on the development of numeracy and literacy skills required for KS3.

KS3 and Numeracy Coordinator working with primary schools to develop appropriate resources to use with eligible pupils when they start All Saints.

The purchase of Timetable Rockstars which is to be used to develop multiplication skills for these pupils.

Year 7 Catch up-Impact to date March 2018

38 out of 42 of these students are working at their target grade or above in Mathematics.

42 out of 60 of these students are working at their target or above in English.

Year 7 Catch Up- Funding and Impact for 2016/17

Year 7 Catch Up Grant Funding Allocation and Spending 2016.2017

Year 7 Catch Up Grant Funding £15,000 actual.

Year 7 Catch Up Grant Expenditure £15,000 used for additional staffing in Maths and English used to create Literacy Groups for pupils (not taking Spanish) and reduce group sizes in Maths and English to facilitate improved targeted wave 1 intervention for eligible pupils.

Year 7 Catch Up Impact 2016.2017

36 out of 58 students achieved or exceeded their target grade in English.

28 out of 50 students achieved or exceeded their target grade in Mathematics.
